# WHAT'S THIS ALL ABOUT?

Anthony Lloyd is a sculptor and printmaker. His work at Fresh Air Sculpture was developed during the Covid lockdown. It was inspired by the way we connect with each other, moving in random orbits that intersect to form new relationships. The sculptures themselves move around, blown by the wind, bump into each other and end up somewhere else.



### GET CREATING!

You can use strips of card to represent the paths we take and create intersections where we meet. Drawing or writing on the strips will add interest to your creation.

#### YOU WILL NEED:

- Heavy weight paper or light card around 300gsm, which could be white or coloured.
- Scissors, coloured pens or pencils and a stapler.

## STEP BY STEP

- 1. Cut twelve strips of card each 3 cm wide and one metre long.
- 2. Draw or write on both sides of the strips





3. Staple the strips to make twelve circles.



5. Continue to add the remaining strips, stapling them as you go, until they are all in place making random orbits and shapes between them.



4. Take two circles and place them accurately at right angles to each other than add a third strip at right angles to the first two. Staple at the intersections.

### WANT MORE?

Try different materials instead of paper such as thin plywood or willow.

Increase the length of the strips to make a larger sculpture.

Place several sculptures together to make an installation.
